Do not park where soft verges are taped and place Parking Permit (issued by marshall collecting Pay & Display fee) to be clearly visible through windscreen.		
Facilities:	Toilets at Forestry Commission Picnic Site (ST167376) about 1.5km after joining forest road – please use these before you reach the 'O' parking a further 1.4 - 1.9 km along forest road (see map overleaf). There is a one way system in use (see map) and returning to the toilets from the parking will be difficult. First Aid. No drinks at finish please bring your own. Dogs allowed, under control		
Map:	1:10,000 scale. A4 size, Waterproof map overprinted with courses If bringing minibus / group please email or telephone Organiser with competitor numbers by course to ensure event map numbers are sufficient.		
Terrain:	Typical Quantock terrain consisting of mixed forest and ancient oak woodlands with some rough open patches. Areas of good run intermixed with patches of bracken and/or brashings. All courses have significant climb distances have been kept 'relatively' short to compensate. Good studded footwear is recommended for negotiating steep slopes. Longer courses cross minor roads but traffic is generally slow and infrequent. There will be no marshalled crossings so please be vigilant and take care . Junior courses stay in the forested area south of the roads and partly use a complex area where there are many unmapped animal tracks in addition to the main paths. A system of tapes and smiling/frowning faces will assist them around their courses where necessary. Adult carers should explain the necessity to juniors to pay attention to and follow the helpful markers


